Cuarto Domingo de Cuaresma

¿Qué es lo que ves? Jesús devolvió la vista a un hombre ciego de nacimiento. No sólo recuperó la vista física, sino que vio las cosas con claridad, a pesar de que las personas que le rodeaban -los líderes religiosos, sus propios padres- estaban cegadas por el miedo. Sus convicciones preconcebidas les mantenían en la oscuridad, incluso cuando la luz del mundo estaba ante ellos, ofreciéndoles una nueva visión. Guiado por la luz de Cristo, el hombre que había estado ciego adoró a Jesús. Samuel miró a los hijos de Jesé a través de los ojos de Dios y encontró al ungido del Señor, no en los mayores y más fuertes, sino en el más joven, David. Al continuar nuestro camino cuaresmal, nos proponemos vivir a la luz del Señor, ver con claridad a través de los ojos de la fe y responder compartiendo la luz de Cristo con el mundo.

VER CON LOS OJOS DE LA FE

Cuando Samuel conoció a los hijos de Jesé, pensó que podía ver al que el Señor ungiría. Sin embargo, encontró la gracia de ver a través de los ojos de la fe y respondió ungiendo a David, que se convertiría en el rey de Israel. Jesús abrió los ojos del ciego de nacimiento. No sabemos a cuántos otros se les abrieron los ojos aquel día, al ver a Jesús como fuente de luz y de vida. Podemos aprender de Samuel y de Jesús, trayendo nuestra oscuridad a la luz a través de la fe. Cuando miramos la vida a través de los ojos de Dios, vemos infinitas posibilidades de bondad, santidad, gracia y paz.

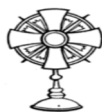

SUY NIỆM CHÚA NHẬT IV MÙA CHAY-A.

Ga 9: 1-41

Trong trình thuật Tin Mừng hôm nay, các môn đệ có cuộc tranh luận với Đức Giêsu: Lý do nào dẫn đến nỗi đau của anh mù? Đó là hậu quả do tội của anh ta hay cha mẹ anh ta? Việc anh mù được chữa lành biểu lộ sự hiện diện năng động của Thiên Chúa trong thế giới này. “*Không phải anh ta, cũng chẳng phải cha mẹ anh ta đã phạm tội. Nhưng sở dĩ như thế là để thiên hạ nhìn thấy công trình của Thiên Chúa được tỏ hiện nơi anh*”.

Đức Giêsu đã trông thấy và dừng lại trước “người mù từ thuở mới sinh”. Người không những chữa lành cho anh, mà sau đó còn đi tìm kiếm anh, trò chuyện với anh và đưa anh tới đức tin. Khi chữa cho anh mù được sáng mắt, Đức Giêsu đã cho anh bước những bước thật dài trên hành trình đức tin. Nhờ vậy, từ sự yếu kém ở chỗ chỉ coi Đức Giêsu như một con người bình thường, trải qua bao khó khăn thử thách, đức tin của anh đã tiến triển không ngừng và đạt đến mức thập toàn khi xác tín rằng Đức Giêsu là vị ngôn sứ, là người bởi Thiên Chúa mà đến, và là Con Người. Người mù tuy mù nhưng lại có thị lực tốt. Anh đã thấy được Đức Giêsu là một ngôn sứ. Anh thấy nhiều cái mà những người sáng mắt không thấy. Anh thấy quyền năng và tình thương của Chúa có thể cho anh được sáng mắt. Anh thấy bằng lòng tin. Chính vì lòng tin này mà Chúa Giêsu đã thương cứu chữa cho anh sáng mắt. Anh mù, mắt không thấy Chúa, nhưng lòng đã thấy Chúa rồi vì anh có lòng tin. Thị lực lòng tin cho anh tiếp nhận ánh sáng tình yêu đầy tràn hy vọng. Đức Giêsu đem lại ánh sáng cho người mù, còn những kẻ vốn nhìn thấy lại trở nên đui mù. Trước sự chống đối của người Phariseu, Đức Giêsu trả lời: “Nếu các ông đui mù, thì các ông đã chẳng có tội. Nhưng giờ đây các ông nói rằng: ‘chúng tôi thấy’, nên tội các ông vẫn còn”.

FEAST OF ST. JOSEPH - MARCH 19TH

The **Solemnity of St. Joseph** is usually celebrated on March 19, but has been transferred to March 20 since the liturgy of the Lenten Sundays take precedence.

After the blessed Virgin Mary St. Joseph is the greatest of the saints. He is the one “into whose custody God entrusted his most precious treasures”, Jesus and Mary. In his Apostolic Exhortation *Custodian of the Redeemer*, Pope St. John Paul II elaborates on this statement of Pope Leo XIII, as it touches upon Mary and Joseph’s vocation with respect to the Incarnation of the Eternal Word - [This is] the mystery in which Joseph of Nazareth “shared” like no other human being except Mary, the Mother of the Incarnate Word. He shared in it with her; he was involved in the same salvific event; he was the guardian of the same love, through the power of which the eternal Father “destined us to be his sons through Jesus Christ” (Eph 1:5). And later, [If] Mary is the Lord’s humble servant, prepared from eternity for the task of being the Mother of God. Joseph is the one whom God chose to be the “overseer of the Lord’s birth”, the one who has the responsibility to look after the Son of God’s “ordained” entry into the world, in accordance with divine dispositions and human laws (*Custodian of the Redeemer*, 8). The Church therefore honors St. Joseph for his faithfulness to God, and to his vocation as Custodian of the Redeemer.

Prayer to St. Joseph

Hail, Guardian of the Redeemer, Spouse of the Blessed Virgin Mary.

**To you God entrusted his only Son; in you Mary placed her trust;
with you Christ became man. Blessed Joseph, to us too, show yourself a father
and guide us in the path of life. Obtain for us grace, mercy and courage,
and defend us from every evil. Amen**
